Safety Reminder

Cold Weather Uniforms

As the weather is getting colder here are a few reminders about uniform requirements.

During the "cold" months the Passport student uniform permits the wearing of warmer clothing. However, these items must meet the following requirements:

- White undershirts are permitted under the uniform shirt. No other color will be permitted. The undershirts should not be visible other than around the neckline.
- Sweatshirts or sweaters may be worn but they
 must be button down or zipper. The only
 pullover sweatshirt permitted over the uniform
 polo is the sweatshirt with logo available
 through the Passport approved vendor.
- Socks must be worn at all times. Stockings ar acceptable, as well.
- Leggings are permitted beginning December 1st through January 31st or if the temperature falls below 50 degrees..
